# THEOLOGY

- God is sovereign behind kings and empires. All dominion comes from him, because all dominion belongs to him.
- God is able to protect his people from man (fiery furnace) and nature (lion's den).

## REDEMPTION

- Christ's kingdom is the tiny rock that grows to crush the pride of the world empires.
- The anointed one, the Son of David, the Son of Man who comes from Heaven will inherit dominion over the earth his kingdom will begin small, but will grow to fill the whole earth.
- God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble.

## APPLICATION

- Faithfulness often feels foolish
- Faithfulness requires humility
- God doesn't promise quick relief but the resurrection will change everything.

### DISCUSSION

- Consider the three confessions (Daniel 2:20-23, Nebuchadnezzar 4:34-35, and Darius 6:26-27)
  - What do we learn about God?
  - What do we learn about mankind? Both individuals and kingdoms.

  - How should this help us think about temptation?
  - What must these boys believe about God and mankind?
- Belshazzar 5:22-23
  - How should this convict us or warn us?
  - What should we learn about God from this?
  - What should we learn about Godly living from this?
